

Our world has changed immensely in the 15 years since Jan Michael approached me to share that s/he was taking testosterone, and gradually transitioned from soprano to land in the One Voice bass section. #### Jane Ramseyer Miller, Artistic Director

Jane Ramseyer Miller is celebrating her 20th year as Artistic Director for One Voice and also serves as Artistic Director for GALA Choruses, a national association of LGBT choruses. She holds Masters in Choral Conducting from the University of Minnesota and a BA in Psychology from the University of Waterloo in Ontario, Canada. She enjoys creative community collaborations and has created choral music with The Women's Cancer Resource Center, Shakopee Women's Correctional Facility, In the Heart of the Beast, Kairos Dance Theatre, Mu Daiko, and Teens Rock the Mic among others. In 2008 she received the GALA Choruses Legacy Award for her conducting, innovative programming and commitment to community outreach. In 2010 she was awarded the ACDA VocalEssence Award for Creative Programming and the ACDA Minnesota Advocate for Choral Excellence (ACE) Award.



#### Mindy Eschedor, Accompanist

Mindy Eschedor is an active Twin Cities collaborative pianist whose engagements regularly include vocal coaching/accompanying, chamber music, and theater work. She has performed with such companies as the Ordway Center for Performing Arts, Nautilus Music-Theater, Guthrie Theater, Chanhassen Dinner Theatres, Interact Theatre, Theater in the Round, Skylark Opera, and Minneapolis Musical Theater. #### **RECLAIM!**

RECLAIM partners with youth ages 13 – 25 who are marginalized because of their gender identity, gender expression, and/or sexual orientation. Through this partnership we strive to create a safe physical, emotional, and relational space so that youth may reclaim their lives and identities from oppression in all its forms. They offer therapy for youth and families, training for practitioners, and community partnerships for social change at the intersection of gender and racial justice. #### **Exploring Gender**

#### **Forgotten Female Composers**

"Women, in general, possess neither artistic sensibility nor genius", wrote the 18th century philosopher Jean-Jacques Rousseau. In those days, women often published their compositions under men's names in order to have them performed. Today, professional women musicians are no longer a novelty but they are still underrepresented as conductors and composers. Few women conductors are employed professionally at an international level and the number of prominent female composers remains small.



#### Why the Butterfly?

When it comes to stereotypes and misunderstanding, transgender people are perhaps the most vulnerable members of our GLBTQA community. The Butterfly is a symbol of transformation that has long been a part of the trans community. A butterfly begins life in one stage, and then transforms into a thing of great beauty by breaking out of the confinement of its cocoon. Butterflies are fragile, and endangered, but they are also fierce – we have all heard about the possibility of the flap of a butterfly's wings causing a storm halfway around the globe. As our trans\* friends spread their wings and fly toward the sun, they are transforming our world. – Kate Lynn Hibbard

#### What does "transgender" mean?

Broadly speaking, transgender people are individuals whose gender expression and/or gender identity differs from conventional expectations based on their physical sex. The word "transgender" or "trans\*" is an umbrella term which is often used to describe a wide range of identities and experiences, including: transsexuals, Female-to-Male, Male-to-Female, cross-dressers, drag queens or kings, two-spirit, gender queers and many more expressions of gender.

## Is being transgender the same as being gay or lesbian?

Like all other people, transgender people can be gay, straight, lesbian, bisexual, or anything in between. Sexual orientation is different from gender identity or expression and can not be assumed about anyone.

#### Tips for Allies of Transgender People

These tips can help you move toward becoming a better ally to transgender people. The list is not exhaustive and cannot include all the "right" things to do or say because there is no "right" answer to every situation you might encounter.

- 1. You can't tell if someone is transgender just by looking. If you don't know what pronouns to use, listen and respect the terminology a transgender person uses to describe their identity.
- 2. Don't make assumptions about a transgender person's sexual orientation.
- 3. Don't ask a transgender person what their "real name" is.
- 4. Be careful about confidentiality, disclosure, and "outing."
- 5. Understand there is no "right" or "wrong" way to transition it is different for every person.
- 6. Don't ask about a transgender person's genitals, surgical status, or sex life.
- 7. Challenge anti-transgender remarks or jokes in public spaces including LGB spaces.
- 8. Support gender neutral public restrooms.
- 9. Actively make your company, place of worship or group truly trans-inclusive.
- 10. Know your own limits as an ally. Don't be afraid to admit when you don't know something.






